
Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs

Maslow's Hierarchy of Human Needs

According to Psychologist Abraham Maslow a person's level of motivation is related to the level at which needs are met.

<u>Self-Actualization</u>--the need for personal growth and the need to realize potential.

<u>Esteem</u>- the need to be considered as adequate, worthy and deserving of respect.

<u>Love and Belonging</u>--the need for acceptance, warmth, affection, and approval from others.

<u>Safety and Security</u>-the need for protection from harm or injury and for security form threats. Money and debt are here.

Physical- the needs of the body, such as food, sleep, shelter and activity.
